#### Interpretation guidelines





### School of Science Student Satisfaction and Effective Teaching Behavior Scale - Lecture


#### A) Class standing




#### **B) Projected Course Grade**




#### C) Course Required?




#### D) Course in Major Field?




#### E) Percent of class sessions attended




#### F) Hours/week spent on course outside of class
